1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of Accounting

The Accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (FRSSE) effective March 2000, under the historical cost convention and in compliance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting by Charities" (SORP 2005).

(b) Income Recognition

Voluntary income is received by way of subscriptions and the holding of congresses and meetings as well as course book sales and is included in full in the Income and Expenditure Account as soon as it is received. Restricted grants are credited to the Income and Expenditure Account to the extent that the related restricted expenditure has occurred.

(c) Value Added Tax

The Charity is not registered for VAT purposes.

(d) <u>Depreciation</u>

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of all tangible fixed assets over their estimated useful lives at the following rates per annum:

The charity holds a large proportion of its funds with in UK bank accounts in both sterling and euros. The calendar years 2013 and 2014 have been years where there have been continual movements in exchange rates and as such, the translation of those closing balances into sterling, required for UK filing, has generated a notional loss (2013 profit) on translation. There are also exchange rate movements in the year relating to receipts and payments.

In the 2014 calendar year, there was a 5% difference between the opening and closing euro rate when compared to sterling and this has led to a hefty paper loss on exchange on the presentation of the Federation's closing position as at 31 December 2014 in relation to the significant balances held in euro bank accounts, and this also impacted on the transfers undertaken when monies were transferred to and from Euro accounts in the year.
