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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2016. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The charity is engaged in Europe wide ultrasound development, encouraging networking between ultrasound professionals disciplines throughout Europe, allowing them to benefit from the wealth of experience and knowledge from other countries and other healthcare systems.

Significant activities

To promote the science of Ultrasound in medicine and biology for the public benefit in particular (but without prejudice to the generality thereof) by (1) promoting the exchange of scientific knowledge in the field of Ultrasound in medicine and biology; (2) promoting research and development in the field of Ultrasound in medicine and biology and publishing the useful results of research (3) proposing standards and giving advice concerning criteria for optimum apparatus and techniques and clinical applications and concerning presentation and interpretation of results (4) arranging congress and study and development meetings on an international level both in and outside Europe by the member organisations, including organising in cooperation with the local committee, a European or world Congress ultrasound in medicine and biology at least once every four years (5) representing the interests of its membership in the World Federation for Ultrasound in medicine and biology and in any other international organisation whose purposes are consistent with the purposes of the Federation"

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

2016 has seen the preparation for an update on Elastography, preparation for an update on Elastography Liver and an update on CEUS non-liver. The world s first ever guidelines on gastrointestinal ultrasound (GIUS) was released by EFSUMB. The successful EFSUMB guidelines published in our official journal, the European Journal of Ultrasound/ Ultraschall in der Medizin are still gaining high attention worldwide.

The recommendations on the use of ultrasound elastography and contrast-enhanced ultrasound have been frequently cited which has contributed to the impact factor (IF) of our journal at present 4.4. A successful Congress was help in Leipzig, Germany. EFSUMB has now conducted way over 100 Euroson Schools across Europe, thus contributing greatly to the advancement of ultrasound knowledge and skills. In 2016 the Education Committee (EPSC) approved 10 Euroson Schools and 20 endorsed courses taking place in 14 different countries.

EFSUMB has included students more closely under the EFSUMB umbrella by establishing a student committee. The Safety Committee continues to review safety statements, the Education Committee is reviewing student ultrasound education and the Publication Committee looking at the role of handheld devices.

EFSUMB webinars have been regularly offered during 2016 with increasing numbers of participants and the subsequent introduction of CME credits. The EFSUMB website including the educational portal is continuously being updated to serve our members optimally.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The principal funding is from the 20,000 members from 28 countries. To support the guidelines consensus meetings EFSUMB invites industry to sponsor these. In addition EFSUMB seeks sponsorship to host the webinars and CEUS Schools which could not otherwise take place.

Reserves policy

Should EFSUMB no longer have the members' financial support the intention is to maintain a reserve for the work of the Federation to continue for a further 3 years whilst alternative support is established. With an income largely in euro the Federation is vulnerable to currency fluctuations.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment

- 25% on reducing balance

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Tavation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
